Artificial Intelligence and Disability Representation: A Creative Masterclass on Getting it Wrong with Catherine Bourne

What will you do on the day?

Explore how arts and Artificial Intelligence (AI) interact and experience how AI blurs the lines between human and non-human representation. Through discussions, hands-on activities and creative demonstrations, you will begin to use AI technology, realise its benefits and sometimes unfortunate and funny limitations! You will get creative with AI technology, using sketching and digital tools to show how AI interprets non-human phenomena. You will create personalised giclee prints of your new discoveries through AI research.

Working Digitally as a Creative or Artistic Producer

with Ruth Fabby

What will you do on the day?

Develop your knowledge in how to use technology to produce and promote your work in the creative sector. Gain confidence in your creative thinking and vision and identify skills and tools to achieve new ambitions. You will explore how to find the right market for your work, how to budget effectively, pitch to potential collaborators, and plan appropriately. You will also learn about funding, legal implications and safeguarding – and you will get to work on a production development idea, to bring all elements together.

Who is it for?

This is a Masterclass for participants who have had some training and experience in their art form and who wish to work as a producer. The Masterclass is not recommended for absolute beginners.

What do you need to bring?

Bring your own laptop (preferably) or tablet. A limited number of tablets available for loan but is preferable to bring your own; please let us know in advance if you need one.

Who is leading this Masterclass?

Now based in Wales, Ruth has developed an extensive career in inclusive arts practise across the UK, most recently as Director of Disability Arts Cymru (DAC) and Artistic Director of DaDaFest in Liverpool. Trading as 'Ruffyarts' Ruth now works freelance, as a producer, writer, performer, professional speaker and offers consultancy for disabled and d/Deaf artists.

Ruth identifies with 'deafness gain' and is neurodivergent.

Composing for Moving Image: The Basics in

Sound Design with Peter Fleming

What will you do on the day?

This Masterclass is suitable for creatives across any artform who want to add sound or music to their creative work as a soundtrack; for example theatre producers, individual performers, writers, animators, visual artists as well as those already engaging with the music industry will find this Masterclass can offer them a new skill to enrich their artistic work. This workshop will also help you to express your creativity across various media platforms and to monetise your work.

Who is it for?

The Masterclass will benefit those interested in learning the fundamentals of recording and those with some basic knowledge.

What do you need to bring?

Bring your own laptop (preferably), tablet or smartphone. We have a few tablets available for loan - please let us know in advance if you need one.



Peter is a musician, songwriter and owner of a professional recording studio, White Mountain Music in Co Derry where he composes music for moving image and television documentaries on ITV, BBC and SKY.

Peter has worked as a production manager for international labels including EMI and Music For Nations and artists including Dolly Parton and The Strokes.

Peter is a stroke survivor and has 70% reduced hearing.

Creative Captions: Integrating Captioning as Part of your Creative Work with Porcelain Delaney

What will you do on the day?

An introduction to creative captions and how to create them. As well as being an accessibility tool, captioning can also serve as an artistic tool to enhance the world you are creating within your performance or artistic practice. You will learn how to use free software such as PowerPoint and Canva with great impact.

Who is it for?

This Masterclass is suitable for beginners as long as they feel comfortable using computer programmes such as PowerPoint. No prior knowledge of captioning is needed.

What do you need to bring?

Bring your own laptop (preferably), tablet or smartphone. We have a few tablets available for loan – please let us know in advance if you need one.

Who is leading this Masterclass?

Porcelain is a disabled theatre maker and multi-disciplinary artist. Her recent show 'Toilet Paper Diaries' about life with chronic gynaecological disease received five-star reviews and features embedded creative captions and audio descriptions. In 2023, Porcelain worked on an inclusive dance show, 'uMoya', with The Liverpool Biennial and South African dance company UnMute. She also worked with organisations like The Circus Of Horrors, DaDa Fest and Graeae Theatre Company.

What will you do on the day?

Set up your own creative online platform and learn how to monetise it. The Masterclass will boost your confidence in creating a prominent creative profile online. This Masterclass will present a safe space for you to explore this experience and how to tackle this new challenge. Before you know it, you will be creating content for your platform like a pro.

Who is it for?

This Masterclass is suitable for beginners with some basic understanding of using social media and the internet.

What do you need to bring?

Bring your own laptop, tablet or smartphone. We have a few tablets available for loan - please let us know in advance if you need one.

Who is leading this Masterclass?

Scotland-based artist Simon has most recently been one of our performers at Bounce Arts Festival 2023. He is an author, performer, workshop leader, who identifies as autistic. He is the founding editor of 'Neurodiverse Review', the first dedicated disabled-led review site. He has written 'We Don't Shop at Waitrose' as part of 'Letters To The Earth' (2019), a memoir Bastardography (2016), short plays for Carabosse Theatre Company and a feature for Looking at You Productions.

Simon played to sold-out audiences at The Edinburgh Fringe, London's King's Head, The Adelaide Fringe and others.

The Digital Innovation Award 2025

The Digital Innovation Award offers a £3000 award to a promising or exceptional artist who is d/Deaf, disabled or neurodiverse to pursue their creative ideas inspired by digital technology. The award is funded by the Santander Foundation as part of the Digital Horizon programme. Our Digital Innovation Award 2023 winner was Stuart Robinson, a



musician, audio engineer, composer, sound designer and technician from Bangor. The Digital Innovation Award 2025 will open for applications in October/November 2024 and close in December 2024. It is an application-based process.

The Ledger Studio is a multi-purpose studio space for artists, individuals and organisations. The Ledger Studio was named after Chris Ledger, who was the Chief Executive Officer of University of Atypical from 2009 to her untimely death in 2020. Chris was a



passionate artist and an advocate for the development of d/Deaf, disabled, and neurodiverse artists. We have dedicated this space in honour of her memory.

The Ledger Studio is a one-room space with an option for blackout curtains. It is suitable for workshops, training, meetings and small performances. It is located on the Ground Floor of the Cathedral Quarter Workspace Building.
